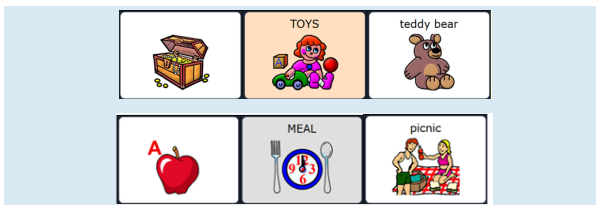


Unity 84 Sequenced Core Word Activity Teddy Bear Picnic

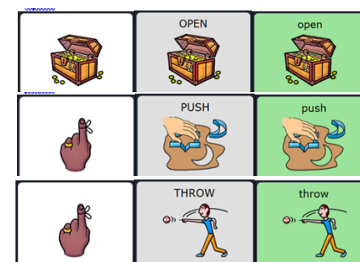
